

Sonic Alert™ DB 200 Wireless Doorbell Signaler



Have you ever missed hearing someone at the door? That's easy to do if you have a hearing loss and your doorbell is in a frequency that's no longer in your range. There are several doorbell alerting devices available to help ensure that you know when someone's at the door.

The **DB 200** is an example of a doorbell and intercom signaler that is easy to install because it has no wiring. Other features include: selectable number of flashes (5 or 10), different flash code for front door, rear door, or intercom (requires additional sensor, sold separately), and a built-in chime for the hearing members of the family (can be turned off). The DB 200 has a built-in outlet to flash an attached lamp and each sends a signal to all Sonic Alert remote receivers.

If you have trouble hearing the telephone ring, you can also use a device like the **DB 200** to be a telephone signaler by plugging the phone cord into a modular telephone jack. Its low equivalent number does not draw any phone line power.
