


#### Zoom for Meetings & Chat

- Basic Free plan includes:
- Enterprise video conferencing with real-time messaging and content sharing
- Host up to 100 participants
   40 mins limit on group meetings
- Unlimited 1 to 1 meetings
- Unlimited number of meetings



### Zoom for Meetings & Chat

- Has CC closed caption options
- Best to use third party CART service
- Al captions "work-a-round" share a screen with Al captions
- Practice before you need captions





#### Google Meet formally Hangouts

- Basic "G" Suite plan includes:
- Enterprise video conferencing with real-time messaging and content sharing



- Has built In Live Al captions
- Google Cloud Gmail, + 9 other Google APPS
- \$6 / user / month 14 Day free trial

#### Microsoft Teams

- Enterprise Video conferencing with real-time messaging and content sharing
- Live AI captions are a preview feature
   Not available in government clouds.
- Background blur
- \$5.00user/month (annual commitment)
- To attend Teams Meeting free





#### Microsoft Skype

- Video conferencing with real-time messaging and content sharing
- Has built In Live subtitles (with Language Translation)
- Host up to 49 participants
- Background blur
- Skype to Skype calls are free



### Google Duo





Google Duo allows for iPhone users to connect with Android Phone users using the Google Duo video chat

## Captioning

CART or Live Event Captioning

(Communication Access Realtime Translation)


More accurate • Requires Skilled Captioner

- Captions can be used with most meeting applications as "Open Captions" for all participants to see
- OR individual participants can be sent a link to be opened in a separate window.

## Captioning

- AI / Machine Voice Recognition
   (Artificial Intelligence)

   Not as accurate, but getting better, Low cost
- Quick substitute for CART "Live Event Captions"
- Mobile Device APPs options
- Desktop options



- Webcaptioner.com (Computer Browser Only)








# How & where do you use (AI) Captioning APPs


- On your phone, tablet, computer
- Anywhere you have internet or cellular connection
- Online, Home, Work, Store, Doctors office,
- Practice before you use it for the first time.

#### Captioning for Online calls or meetings



- On a video call
- Place your phone near the speaker
- Turn up the computer volume
- Practice before important meetings

#### Captioning at home



- Watching TV When there is no captions
- Hold your phone or place where you can read the captions comfortably
- Turn the TV volume up
- Practice/ experiment before you need it

#### **Captioning for Social Interactions**



- Social Distancing (People with masks)
- Social Interactions
- Hold your phone out so microphone can pick up the person talking
- Practice/ experiment before you need it

#### Live Transcribe by Google

- Powered by Google's speech recognition technology, so the captions adjust as your conversation flows.
- Easy to use, anywhere you have a WIFI or cellular network connection.
- Google partnered with Gallaudet University, to make sure that Live Transcribe was helpful for everyday use.



Android ONLY - FREE

#### **AVA**

- People can use their own phones microphone in group conversations

  NOTE: Only the person "hosting" the conversation needs to pay others can join free of charge.
- Good for social distancing at any distance
- Caption any live conversation
- 5 hours Free per month
- \$14.99/mo/host \$180.00/year



#### **OTTER**

- Otter is free up to 600 minutes/month and paid subscription options are available.
- iOS devices & Android devices
- You can also use it on a desktop computer
- \$8.33/ month \$100.00/year




#### **Transcribe LIVE**

- First 15 minutes are free of charge
- IOS devices
- One time purchase of minutes or a monthly subscription can be purchased in the app
- \$ 108.00/year or \$2.99/hour + other options



#### Webcaptioner.com

- Free Captioning in your web browser
- Requires Chrome web browser
- You can give a donation to support continued free access
- Great for video meeting calls if you have two screens




#### (AI) Voice Recognition APPs

• Pages (Apple IOS) - Free

- Sorenson BuzzCards
  - Allows you to pre-type messages
  - For everyday situations
- Jeenie
  - Live ASL interpreting
  - \$1.00/minute
